The Gigabit Infrastructure Act (GIA) for deployment of 5G millimeter wave technology must be postponed

October 11, 2023

The EU Commission has proposed a regulation called the Gigabit Infrastructure Act (GIA) for deployment of 5G millimeter technology. The proposal unilaterally favors telecom industry. It would pave the way for much denser 5G infrastructure technology, mainly millimeter wave technology (26 GHz and above).

The GIA proposal lacks health and environmental impact assessments on (a) the cumulative radiofrequency (RF) radiation exposure from the 5G until now and (b) the total radiation after planned deployment of new millimeter wave technology. No studies prove that humans, especially children, flora and fauna can tolerate the total radiation exposure that will be the consequence.

The GIA is contrary to the consolidated version of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFEU) Article 3 stating that the objectives of the EU include 'a contribution to a high level of health protection' and Article 168 that a high level of human health protection shall be ensured in the definition and implementation of all Union policies.

The 433 scientists and physicians who have endorsed the 5G Appeal (www.5gappeal.eu), ask for a moratorium on the 5G roll-out until the health risks have been fully investigated by scientists with no conflicts of interest and truly independent from the industry that benefits from 5G.

The majority of scientists in this field agree in the EMF Scientists Appeal (www.emfscientist.org) that research on health effects from previous generations of wireless technologies show increasing evidence of harmful effects such as DNA damage, oxidative stress, on reproduction and well-being, and increased cancer risks

A democratic society like EU must ensure that the environment and humans, especially children, will not be exposed to new forms of radiation never experienced in history. The burden of proof to demonstrate absence of serious environmental and health impacts must be placed on those industries responsible for the exposure, on the EU and health agencies before supporting 5G expansion.

Several expert groups, e.g. ICBE-EMF¹, Health Council of the Netherlands² and EU Parliament's STOA³, have concluded there is insufficient or no studies on health impacts from 5G millimeter waves.

To date, only four case studies have examined the health impact of real life exposure to radiation from 5G antennas deployed to date at frequencies around 3.5 GHz. All show rapidly developing adverse health impacts. GIA additions will increase the risks.

We therefore ask for the GIA to be postponed until truly independent research has shown that this technology is safe for humans and all biological life. To deploy this technology without safety testing would force all European people to be "guinea pigs" in a massive health experiment which infringes several EU laws and the treaty, see Annex.

Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union (2012/C 326/02)⁵

Article 3 Right to the integrity of the person

- 1. Everyone has the right to respect for his or her physical and mental integrity.

 (a) the free and informed consent of the person concerned, according to the procedures laid down by law;

The physical and mental integrity of each person is being corrupted by electromagnetic pulses from wireless technologies.

The NIR technologies have been rolled out before adequate research has been conducted into the biological effects. Consequently, all peoples are part of a global experiment, without their consent, on how these technologies will affect humans in the long run, mentally, emotionally, physically and spiritually.

Article 8 Protection of personal data

Everyone has the right to the protection of personal data concerning him or her.

2. Such data must be processed fairly for specified purposes and on the basis of the consent of the person concerned or some other legitimate basis laid down by law.

Smart meter data is not secure and private.

The data that is being collected is more than is needed for invoicing. It is being taken for marketing and control purposes, several times a minute, putting human health at risk.

Article 31

Fair and just working conditions

1. Every worker has the right to working conditions which respect his or her health, safety and dignity

Technologies in the workplace, such as GPS tracking continuously on in vehicles and tablets is being mandated during working hours.

Article 3

1. In all actions concerning children, whether undertaken by public or private social welfare institutions, courts of law, administrative authorities or legislative bodies, the best interests of the child shall be a primary consideration

The health and wellbeing of children is not protected. The new ICNIRP guidelines do not consider babies or children as different from adults, and therefore offer no special precautions to protect them.

Testing of phones uses 6-30 min. heating of liquid in a very large plastic phantom head⁵². Testing does not include long-term exposures of heads the size of children.
